Enduring enamel

Elegantly perched on the staircase at Kingshaugh is a white enamel jug. An art form begun in ancient China, it was not until the mid-19th Century that enamelling on metal turned commercial. Britain produced plain, simple designs, while France and Germany created more imaginative, coloured items.
